I'm sorry to have to start this week's newsletter with a message for a tiny minority of our school community but unfortunately, we have had a small number of incidents over the last couple of weeks where members of staff have been subjected to verbally aggressive and threatening language either in person or over the phone. No member of staff should be subjected to any form of abuse as part of their work, just as you would not expect to be exposed to it at your workplaces. We are firm supporters of the NAHT campaign, No Excuse for abuse ('No excuse for abuse' campaign) and have a clear acceptable behaviour of adults policy Acceptable behaviour of adults in school September 2024.pdf on our website that sets out how we expect people to conduct themselves at all times on school grounds or when communicating with school staff.



We understand and accept that we don't always get things right and that the issues with Scholarpack and SeeSaw at the moment may also cause additional issues with communication. Please bear with us for the last two weeks and as we start to get Compass to be the much-improved experience we expect it to be for all parents. We always welcome you getting in touch with us directly to resolve any problems but please remember that any errors or differences of opinions are not intentional and should not be met with swearing, shouting or the other behaviours we have seen and are detailed in our policy. A polite contact with us is always likely to get a quicker resolution as otherwise staff may feel they have to pass the issue to more senior members or have additional members of staff present in a more formal meeting which will take time to organise.

Just in case parents have not been able to view the information, we wanted to make you aware of some exciting developments at Edgewood. From the beginning of January, we will be changing and streamlining a lot of the ways we communicate with you onto a single platform called Compass. There are more details in THIS LETTER

Compass will replace Scholarpack and SeeSaw from 5th January 2026. We will also be using it for paying for trips and book bags etc. from the same date. After February half term, we will then be using it for school meals instead of Ipay, so you will have all your systems in one place.

Compass newsfeeds will be a great source of information for you from your class and also from the school as a whole and will hopefully make your lives so much easier moving forwards. Please keep reading the letters coming out before Christmas so you are ready for the switch when we come back in January.
